area that are not aesthetically pleasing and are constantly being set-up within the NANDC boundary. The dangers of potential health risks from radiation coming these cell phone towers is not known and was discussed that the board would investigate this as well.

- e. Economic Development: Shawn Simons – June 24th forum
 - i. ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEM: forum update
 - ii. USC was present at the last forum, June 24th, to make a presentation about the UV project. At the next meeting there will be discussions between community members about the Community Benefits Package. All are welcomed to attend and give their input.
- 4. **Discussion:** 851 W. 23rd Street – **presentation** Carolina Abrego-Pineda (Carolina Abrego-Pineda Consulting Services) **(20 min)**
 - a. Motion to support building project Leslie/2nd Ashley – Majority Voted YES. Those that voted NO: Gabriela, Moises, Ana, Andrea and Hector.
 - b. The project consists of an application in variance to section 1209. The following changes will occur:
 - i. 2 new apartment units 636 sq fit, and 1500 sq ft
 - ii. There are 3 buildings with 8 legal units and 3 illegal units. The 3 illegal units will become legal under this application.
 - iii. There will be 11 parking spaces for all three buildings.
 - iv. There was discussion about affordable housing. Representatives of this unit said no one would be displaced. All tenants are still living in this complex.
- 5. **Discussion:** 1230 W 36TH ST 90007 - **presentation** CESAR AGUIRRE - L & V ARCHITECTS **(20 min)**
 - a. This application is by right. There were no ordinances opposing this project. The project will demolish a single unit house and will begin construction of a new house. There will be 5 units total, which will be offered to anyone in the community. The board asked if these units were specifically catered to students. Representatives for this project mentioned that the owner will be in charge of renting out apartments. Comments from community included USC Public Safety officer who asked that the owner be reachable and committed to community to ensure appropriate behavior from students.
- 6. **Discussion/Action:** FRIENDS and NEIGHBORS DAY - Ashley Ramos **(15 min)**
 - a. Friends and Neighbors Day will be August 21st from 8am to 1pm. USC students will meet on campus and go into the community to serve. NANDC will participate during this community service event.
 - b. Ideas for service are: health awareness event at Lyon Center/USC Gym, Tree Planting or Area Clean up with 3 different sites corresponding to the three NANDC Areas. The board decided to do the Area clean up with the following people submitting sites for clean up: Area 1 – Yelba, Area 2 – Ana, Area 3 – Al.

 - a. Motion to approve spending on a banner for National Night Out up to \$500 and getting the banner from a local vendor – motion by Rohan/ 2nd Ashley – All voted YES.

ot be successful a strong police presense will be necessary so NANDC will need to partner with block clubs. Leslie Evans will coordinate event and contact block club captains.
