Action/Discussion: The Slow Streets Program, managed by LADOT with support from StreetsLA, will allow residents, and neighborhood groups to apply for temporary through-traffic restrictions in their neighborhoods to create a safe place to walk, bike, or play at a social distance. Also, the NCSA Transportation Committee is working with “Streets For All,” which has a proposal to open up streets to people during the pandemic and requests support.

Ralph M. Brown Act 54954.2. (a) At least 72 hours before a regular meeting, the legislative body of the local agency, or its designee, shall post an agenda containing a brief general description of each item of business to be transacted or discussed at the meeting, including items to be discussed in closed session. A brief general description of an item generally need not exceed 20 words. The agenda shall specify the time and location of the regular meeting and shall be posted in a location that is freely accessible to members of the public. If requested, the agenda shall be made available in appropriate alternative formats to persons with a disability, as required by Section 202 of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 12132), and the federal rules and regulations adopted in implementation thereof. The agenda shall include information regarding how, to whom, and when a request for disability-related modification or accommodation, including auxiliary aids or services may be made by a person with a disability who requires a modification or accommodation in order to participate in the public meeting.
