

Project Description & Entitlement Requested

- Pursuant to L.A.M.C. Section 14.00.B
- A Public Benefit Alternative Compliance to allow for the use and maintenance of an existing 2,471 square foot dwelling as a Young Korean Academy site as a cultural, educational, and civic resource for both local residents and the broader Korean American community.
- The Young Korean Academy Historic Site is a nationally and internationally recognized cultural landmark. Established by Dosan Ahn Chang Ho in 1913, the Academy played a central role in Korea's independence movement and in shaping the early Korean American community. The property is Los Angeles Historic Cultural Monument (HCM) No. 1274.

Historic Status | 3421-3423 S. Catalina Street



Young Korean Academy Annual Convention in 1937 at 3421 S. Catalina Street.

- Historic-Cultural Monument (HCM) -1274 as Hung Sa Dahn (Young Korean Academy)
- Significant for its role as an important hub for the Korean American community (Criterion 1).
 - YKA cultivated leadership, moral integrity, and civic responsibility among Korean immigrants
 - Helped to foster sense of Korean national identity during Japanese occupation (1910-1945)
 - Property served as gathering place, meeting space, office, and housing
- Period of significance in HCM: 1929 to 1978

Notably, the building is quite spacious and a two-story house, which is why the price is considered very affordable. Public Benefit

- Preservation of Cultural and Historic Legacy
 The rehabilitation of the Young Korean Academy Historic Site preserves a nationally significant landmark associated with the Korean independence movement and Dosan Ahn Chang Ho. This enhances public understanding of shared cultural heritage and contributes to Los Angeles' leadership in historic preservation.
- Community-Based Educational and Cultural Programming
 The project will provide free public workshops, cultural lectures,
 and heritage talks in collaboration with community partners.
 These programs promote civic engagement, cross-cultural
 dialogue, and intergenerational learning, all accessible to the
 broader public.
- Neighborhood and Civic Enhancement
 Located in a historically rich area near USC, the project supports ongoing traditions of education and activism. The rehabilitation improves the built environment and delivers essential cultural and educational services that benefit the surrounding community, the city of Los Angeles, and the region at large.

The proposed project complies with all applicable conditions of approval with the exception of two specific requirements, which are detailed below. In accordance with the applicable provisions, we are requesting alternative compliance for these items. The proposed alternatives continue to meet the intent of the original conditions while ensuring the project remains consistent.


12. THE SITE IS A CORNER SITE.


• Alternative Compliance Measure. The proposed project involves the use and maintenance of an existing 2,485-square-foot, 27-foot 3-inch-tall single-family dwelling, annex duplex and new addition as a community center and offices for South Korean government. The site is located approximately 215 feet to the south of the nearest major intersection of Jefferson Boulevard and Catalina Street. The proposed project substantially meets the purpose of this Performance Standard.

13. THE MAJORITY OF THE FRONTAGE IS ON A MAJOR OR SECONDARY HIGHWAY.


Alternative Compliance Measure. The site is located approximately 215


